CONSTITUTION OF THE HONG KONG DIVISION OF THE INTERNATIONAL ACADEMY OF PATHOLOGY

NAME

The Society shall be called The Hong Kong Division of the International Academy of Pathology, thereafter referred to as the Society

OBJECTIVE

1.The aims of the Society shall be to advance the knowledge and practice of pathology.

REGISTERED ADDRESS

2.The registered address of the Society shall be Department of Pathology, Queen Mary Hospital, Hong Kong.

MEMBERSHIP

3.Membership shall consist of Ordinary Members, Associate Members and Honorary Members.

4.Ordinary Members shall normally consist of those who possess a medical qualification and are following a career in pathology.

5.Associate members shall normally consist of non-medically qualified personnel who have demonstrated an interest in pathology.

6.Persons distinguished for eminent services to medicine and especially to the cause of pathology and to this Society may be made Honorary Members on recommendation of the Council.

7.Only Ordinary Members have the right to vote in General Meetings and be elected as members of the Council.

8.All applications for membership shall be decided by the Council. Each application shall be proposed by an Ordinary member.

9.The annual subscription of the Society, payable by all Ordinary and Associate Members, shall be fixed by the Council and shall be payable in advance. Members whose subscriptions are two years or more in arrears may be disqualified from membership at the discretion of the Council.

10.Honorary Members shall be exempt from subscriptions.

MEETINGS

11.The supreme authority of the Society shall be vested in the Annual and Extraordinary General Meetings.

12.The Society shall hold its Annual General Meeting each year, the programme of which shall consist of:

- a.The business meeting, which shall include the President's report, Secretary's report, the Treasurer's

report and the election of Officers and Councillors and consideration of such business as may be required.

b.The Council shall meet before and after the business meeting and take action on such matters as are brought to it.

13.At least fourteen days before the General Meeting, notice thereof specifying the place, date, time and agenda of the Meeting shall be distributed to all members.

14.The Council may, whenever it thinks fit, and shall upon a requisition in writing by not less than one-fifth of the total Ordinary Members addressed to the Secretary convene an Extraordinary General Meeting. The Council shall, within twenty-one days after the receipt of the said requisition, proceed duly to convene such meeting.

15.The quorum of any General Meeting shall be one-sixth of all Ordinary Members. If within one hour from the time appointed for a General Meeting a quorum is not present, the Meeting shall reconvene within fourteen days. A notice to this effect shall be distributed again to all members at least seven days before the meeting. Whatever number of Ordinary Members present at that meeting shall then constitute a quorum.

THE COUNCIL AND THE OFFICERS

16.The Council shall consist of four Officers, namely, President, President-Elect, Secretary and Treasurer; and in addition two Councillors.

17.The Council shall formulate policies and shall authorise disbursement of the Society's funds to further the objectives of the Society.

18.The President, President-Elect, Secretary and Treasurer shall discharge the duties usually assigned to these offices. The Council shall appoint such permanent and temporary committees and co-opted members as are necessary for the proper administration of the Society's affairs.

19.The Secretary, with the aid of appropriate committees, shall arrange all meetings.

20.All Council Members, as defined in Article 16, including the President, President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer and the two Councillors shall be nominated and seconded by any Ordinary member of the Society in

writing to the Secretary at least seven days before the Annual General Meeting.

21.Council members shall be elected by simple majority of Ordinary Members attending the Annual General Meeting should the number of nominees exceed that of the corresponding posts. Otherwise, the nominees shall be elected ipso facto.

22.The term of office of the Council members shall be for one year.

23.A quorum of the Council shall consist of three Council members, at least one of whom shall be an Officer.

USE OF FUNDS

24.The funds of the Society may be used by the Council for any lawful purpose to further the objectives of the Society.

LIABILITY OF MEMBERS

25.The Society is an unincorporated association and all Ordinary Members have unlimited liability on a basis of equal distribution.

CHANGES IN THE CONSTITUTION

26.Amendments to the constitution shall first be submitted to the Secretary in writing for consideration by the Council. The proposed amendment and the recommendation of the Council shall be submitted to the members either at a General Meeting or by correspondence. A two-thirds majority vote of those Ordinary members present at a General Meeting or those voting when polled by correspondence, shall be required for the adoption of the proposed amendment.

DISSOLUTION

27.The Society shall be dissolved if at a General Meeting of the Society held for that purpose, a resolution to that effect is passed by at least three-fourths of the total number of its Ordinary Members.

28.If the Society shall be dissolved, any surplus assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its liabilities shall not be paid out or distributed to the members, but shall be transferred to such association(s), having objectives similar to those of this Society, as the members shall by resolution direct.
